This permit should be issued in triplicate. The original must accompany the remains to destination; the duplicate should be retained by the person delivering the remains for removal and the triplicate must be kept on file by the local registrar who issues it.

NOTE.—The law authorizing the issuance of this permit reads in part: "Any person entitled by law to remove an interred dead body or to remove the cremated remains of a dead body may apply to the local registrar for a permit to remove such interred body or the cremated remains of such body, as the case may be, and the local registrar shall forthwith issue such permit, retaining a copy thereof, for which he shall receive a fee of fifty cents to be paid him by the applicant for the permit."
